

Intensive outpatient treatment for those with current or past opioid misuse. Six IOP sessions are provided by SAHL and then six months of aftercare provided by MCMHA. During the program, you will complete classwork on substance use, be provided tools to help maintain sobriety, and a prevention plan will be created with you. Aftercare treatment looks different for everyone but will focus on continued and sustained recovery. You will be given a case manager to help create your plan and help with any needs or supports once you're released.
